ASA Home and Community-Based Services Waiver

The Medicaid Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) waiver program is authorized in §1915(c) of the Social Security Act.

- Permits a State to furnish an array of home and community-based services that assist Medicaid beneficiaries to live in the community and avoid institutionalization.
- The State has broad discretion to design its waiver program to address the needs of the waiver's target population.
- Waiver services complement and/or supplement the services that are available to participants through the Medicaid State Plan and other federal, state and local public programs as well as the supports that families and communities provide.

ASA Home and Community-Based Services Waiver

Eligibility requirements:

- Age 65 or older or over the age of 18 with a qualifying disability;
- Receiving Supplemental Security Income or has an income level within 300% of the Supplemental Security Income standard benefit amount and meets the eligibility criteria established by the Division of Economic Assistance;
- Meets nursing facility level of care as determined by the Medical Review Team; and
- Consumers can reside at home, in a rental, or in an assisted living center while receiving waiver services.

Waiver services include:

- Homemaker
- Personal Care
- In-Home Nursing
- Respite Care
- Specialized Medical Equipment
- Specialized Medical Supplies
- Adult Companion Services
- Assisted Living
- Environmental Accessibility Adaptations
- Meals and Nutritional Supplements
- Personal Emergency Response Systems

ASA Home and Community-Based Services

FY16 Numbers Served

- Assisted Living
 - 700 consumers (Avg. Monthly)
- In Home Services:
 - 6,431 consumers (Avg. Monthly)
- Adult Day:
 - 182 consumers (Avg. Monthly)
- Senior Meals:
 - 4,920 consumers (Avg. Daily)
- Other Services – Specialized Medical Equipment & Supplies, Adult Companion, Personal Emergency Response, etc.)
 - 511 consumers

ASA Home and Community-Based Services

Provider Qualifications:

- Providers must complete an online enrollment application to apply through the Division of Medical Services
- Providers must sign a standard South Dakota Medicaid Provider Agreement and pass mandatory provider enrollment screening and credentialing criteria and contract for services
- Licensed providers must provide verification of current, valid licensure
- Providers must sign a Supplemental Agreement and complete a HCBS Settings Self-Assessment
- In addition to the standard Medicaid requirements, providers must be compliant with the Home and Community-Based Settings Final Rule.

ASA Home and Community-Based Services Waiver

Waiver renewal application was submitted July 1, 2016 with an anticipated effective date October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2021

Proposed changes include:


- Addition of chore services
- Expansion of medical equipment definition to include assistive technology
- Increased maintenance needs allowance for in-home consumers to ensure consumers can meet their financial obligations and remain at home— i.e. rent, utilities, etc.
- Increased earned income allowance for consumers residing in an assisted living center by an additional \$75.

Supporting Transitions to Community Services

Money Follows the Person: Provides transition services to institutionalized individuals to transition to home and community based settings.

- Recommended by Medicaid Solutions Workgroup
- Targets Medicaid eligibles institutionalized for 90 days or more
- Provides MFP Services during transition and for 365 days following transition:
 - Transition Services
 - Non-Medical Transportation
 - Assistive Technology
 - Consumer Preparation
 - Behavior Crisis Intervention
