HB 1133* (Fiscal Note) establish the Legislature's Planning Committee.

HB 1230 (Deferred from 20th LD) modify the publication requirements regarding the application for a well driller license or a well pump installer license.

- HB 1270* revise the time period for which unclaimed property is presumed abandoned and to revise certain provisions regarding the publication notice of unclaimed property.
- HB 1185* prohibit all qualified health plans offered through a health care exchange from including abortion coverage.
- HB 1219* revise certain provisions relating to the process of collecting DNA upon arrest for a qualifying offense.
- HB 1164* ~~appropriate money for the repair of state-owned dams managed by the Office of School and Public Lands and the Department of Game, Fish, and Parks.~~
Revise certain provisions regarding the sale of certain surplus property in Yankton County.
- HB 1199* revise certain provisions related to the distribution of funds to sparse school districts.
- HB 1228* repeal the sunset concerning tax refunds for new or expanded agricultural facilities and new or expanded business facilities.
- HB 1189* establish a deadline within each semester after which no student may transfer to a school district other than the resident school district through the enrollment options program.
- HB 1193* regulate the sale of dextromethorphan and to provide a penalty thereto.
- HB 1253* prohibit the judicial enforcement of any religious codes.
- HB 1136 revise the state aid to education formula and to make an appropriation.
- HB 1137 affect medical services.
- HB 1220 conditionally repeal certain provisions establishing network adequacy standards, quality assessment and improvement requirements, utilization review and benefit determination requirements, and grievance procedures for managed health care plans, and certain standards for managed health care plans if the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act is found to be unconstitutional.
- HB 1242* revise the general appropriations act for fiscal year 2012.
- HB 1126* ~~establish provisions that a bond paid by, or on behalf of, a defendant in a criminal case shall be paid to the Department of Social Services to pay any child support the defendant owes.~~
Establish provisions that certain bonds paid by, or on behalf of, certain persons with child support arrearages shall be paid to the Department of Social Services to pay any child support the defendant owes.
- HB 1255* prohibit the enforcement of surrogacy arrangements.
- HB 1266* reduce the period of time necessary to cure and validate certain adoption proceedings.
- HB 1273* prohibit the sale of loose leaf incense to minors, to prohibit certain marketing techniques, to regulate the sale of certain types of incense, to provide penalties therefor, and to declare an emergency.

- SB 32* (Remove from Consent Calendar) revise the suitability requirements for annuities.
- SB 4 make an appropriation to continue the veterans' bonus program and to declare an emergency.
- SB 9 make an appropriation to reimburse certain family physicians and dentists who have complied with the requirements of the physician tuition reimbursement program and dental tuition reimbursement program and to declare an emergency.

- SB 36 make an appropriation for costs related to suppression of wildfires in the state and to declare an emergency.
- SB 38* provide for the transfer of control of an office building in Rapid City, to make an appropriation for the construction and renovation of the office building, and to declare an emergency.
- SB 45 appropriate additional funds and to extend the availability of appropriations to replace storage facilities at the Cottonwood Agricultural Experiment Station.
- SB 35 update certain citations to federal regulations and increase certain civil penalties regarding pipeline safety inspection.
- SB 99* ~~provide for a temporary suspension of certain licenses relating to alcoholic beverages under emergency conditions.~~
Prohibit certain licensees or employees of a licensed establishment who have been charged with certain felony offenses from entering the licensed premises and to provide a penalty therefor.
