BE IT REMEMBERED, That on the tenth day of January, A.D., two thousand twelve, at the hour of twelve o'clock meridian, being the date and hour fixed by the Constitution of the State of South Dakota, for the convening of the Legislature, the Eighty-seventh regular session of the Senate of the State of South Dakota was called to order by Lieutenant Governor Matt Michels in the Senate Chamber in the Capitol, in the City of Pierre, the seat of our government.

2 administration may be conducted in righteousness and be eminently useful to Your people
3 over whom he presides. May he execute the laws with justice and mercy.

4 Let the light of Your divine wisdom direct the deliberations of this legislature and
5 shine forth in all the proceedings and laws framed for our rule and government. May these
6 faithful legislators seek to preserve peace, promote happiness, and continue to bring us the
7 blessings of liberty, morality and equality.

8 We pray for our judges, elected civil officials and all others who are entrusted to guard
9 our political welfare. May they be enabled by Your powerful protection to discharge their
10 duties with honesty and ability.

11 We likewise commend to Your mercy all citizens of South Dakota, that we may be
12 blessed in the knowledge and sanctified in the observance of Your holy law. May we all be
13 preserved in union and share in the peace that comes from You. And after enjoying the
14 blessings of this life, may we be admitted to eternal life with You.

15 We pray to You, Lord and God, for ever and ever. Amen.
