WHEREAS, the Great Ruler of the Universe has ordered a final adjournment in the lives of eleven former members of the South Dakota Legislature, namely: the *Honorable Elmer Diedtrich*; the *Honorable Jay L Duenwald*; the *Honorable Derald B. Gellhaus*; the *Honorable Donald A. Haggar*; the *Honorable John B. Heilman*; the *Honorable Ralph D. Homan*; the *Honorable Stanley A. Johnson*; and the *Honorable Patricia E. Kenner*; *Gilbert "Gil" Koetzle*; *the The Honorable Alice Kundert*; and the *Honorable John D. Sears*.

WHEREAS, in the lives of all these eminent public servants there was noted a profound urgency in an unselfish manner, with trials and vicissitudes often far outweighing honors, but with a consciousness that here in a land of freedom the dignity of the individual is supreme, that justice must be dispensed, and that only by eternal vigilance and unrelenting effort can self-government of a people be preserved; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that we humbly honor the memory of those who have thus contributed to the orderly process of government under the Constitution:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Eighty-ninth Session of the Legislature of the State of South Dakota duly convened in recess session in recognition of the useful lives and unflinching devotion to the interests of the State of South Dakota, as well as the rectitude of thought and action and fidelity to the highest principles of American citizenship by these honorable people, that the Senate and the House of Representatives do now pause in their labors out of respect for the memory of their late fellow associates in the functions of government, and note that in their passing, the state they have served so well has suffered a distinct loss, and though their labors have ceased and they have been laid to rest, the people of this great state have benefited greatly from the services rendered by them and they have left upon the sands of time an inspiring record of devotion to their fellow citizens under the guiding hand of Almighty God; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution be printed in the Journals of the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Eighty-ninth Session of the Legislature of the State of South Dakota, now assembled this 23rd day of January, 2014, at Pierre, South Dakota.

Lutheran. Republican. Graduated from Bowdle High School, 1944; Bachelor of Science, Northern State University, 1956. World War II, US Navy Veteran. Reenlisted, assigned to the Naval Intelligence. Later joined the National Guard. Elmer was able to fly on the WW II Honor Flight. Elmer was an Insurance broker, member of Life Underwriters, Elks, Moose, and Eagles, He was a devoted member of the brotherhood of Masons and Shrine, Order Eastern Star, SD Wildlife, Pheasants Forever, Ducks Unlimited. Elmer loved snowmobiling, boating, and flying airplanes.

In 2000, Elmer was prime sponsor of the “Kuchen” bill as the state dessert.

A Fourth Degree member of the Knights of Columbus, served as Grand Knight, District Deputy, and highest state officer, State Deputy. Jay was SD delegate to the National Right to Life Committee from 1988 - 2011. Also President and regional director of SD Right to Life Board. Honored as SDRTL Humanitarian of the Year Award in 2011. Hoven Citizen of the Year in 1997. Avid outdoorsman. Music was a large part of Jay's life, he was a lead tenor in many events.

Don practiced law and was a managing partner in K. Haggar and Brothers Grocery in Sioux Falls. Appointed SD State Highway Director, 1960. One of his proudest accomplishments during his tenure, was overseeing the construction of I-90 and I-29. Remaining in Pierre, he practiced law, served as a lobbyist, and operated a farm & ranch real estate company.

Johnson was appointed by Governor Nils Boe to fill a vacancy in District 17. He was re-elected to serve three more terms.

He was an active member of the Cathedral of St. Joseph; past board member of St. Vincent de Paul. Passions in Gil’s life were family and community.

Alice Kundert

Taught in rural and grade schools in Campbell and Walworth Counties; managed retail establishments in California. Family illness brought Alice back to SD. She served as Campbell County Deputy Superintendent of Schools, as County Clerk of Courts, Register of Deeds, and Mound City Treasurer. Alice was elected to the South Dakota Office of State Auditor in 1969. She was elected and served as Secretary of State 1979 to 1987. She ran for Governor of the State of South Dakota and was defeated. She was appointed Coordinator of Schools for the SD Centennial celebration. She returned to Campbell County where she was elected from the 23rd District as State Representative. Alice served as promoter, advisor, counselor for the Teen Age Republican events. Alice served in many SD organizations and received numerous awards for her work with many boards. She received the Doane Robinson Award for outstanding service to the State of South Dakota in preservation of South Dakota History. Alice was inducted into the SD Hall of Fame.

John was instrumental in winning approval for legislation creating the State-Tribal Committee and the video lottery system in South Dakota.
