1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to add emergency medical technicians and paramedics to
2 the list of mandatory reporters, and to update cross references in the section.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That § 26-8A-3 be amended to read:

5 26-8A-3. Any physician, dentist, doctor of osteopathy, chiropractor, optometrist, emergency
6 medical technician, paramedic, mental health professional or counselor, podiatrist, psychologist,
7 religious healing practitioner, social worker, hospital intern or resident, parole or court services
8 officer, law enforcement officer, teacher, school counselor, school official, nurse, licensed or
9 registered child welfare provider, employee or volunteer of a domestic abuse shelter, employee
10 or volunteer of a child advocacy organization or child welfare service provider, chemical
11 dependency counselor, coroner, or any safety-sensitive position as defined in ~~subdivision 23-3-~~
12 ~~64(2)~~ § 3-6C-1, who has reasonable cause to suspect that a child under the age of eighteen has
13 been abused or neglected as defined in § 26-8A-2 shall report that information in accordance
14 with §§ 26-8A-6, 26-8A-7, and 26-8A-8. Any person who intentionally fails to make the



1 required report is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. Any person who knows or has reason to
2 suspect that a child has been abused or neglected as defined in § 26-8A-2 may report that
3 information as provided in § 26-8A-8.
